



# Organizing the Process

- Start early!
- Time management
- Review junior checklist
- Find a system that works for your family
- Track application and financial aid deadlines
- Know application requirements for each college
  - Auditions, portfolios, interviews, testing, etc.
- Process is designed for all junior and senior students to do independently (parents/guardians and school counselors are here to support)


- Marblehead School Code: 221-325
- All tests are digital format

#### Test length and scoring

- Test used to determine college readiness
- Evidence-Based Reading & Math
- Score is out of 1600
  - 800 for Math & 800 for EBR
- Test length is 3 hours

## Students responsible for submitting scores

- Most colleges superscore
- Consider the top score for each section
- Required to submit full scores

# **ACT Info**

#### Register at <u>www.actstudent.org</u>

- Marblehead School Code: 221-325
- Available in digital or paper and pencil format
- Colleges will accept either SAT or ACT

#### Students are responsible for submitting scores

Some schools will superscore but not all

#### Test Length and Scoring

- Math, Reading, English, Science
  - Essay portion is optional
- 3 hours and 35 minutes (including essay portion 40 minutes)
- Beginning April 2025
  - Science portion is optional
  - Fewer questions
  - Test length will be just over 2 hours
- Scoring based on scale from 1 36



# Test Day Reminders

#### Preparing for test day: SAT guidelines <u>here</u>

- On test day, students must bring:
  - Compatible / fully charged testing device
  - Charging cord
  - Admission ticket
  - Photo ID
  - Pencils
  - Calculator (or use the one in Bluebook)
  - Water/snack

## Preparing for test day: ACT guidelines <u>here</u>

- On test day, students must bring
  - Admission ticket
  - Photo ID
  - Pencils
  - Calculator
  - Water/snack



# Test Optional

- Check college requirements
- Test optional vs. test blind
- Test Flexible
  - Colleges/Universities allow students to choose which type of test they want to submit with their application (i.e. SAT, ACT, or AP Scores)
- Test optional college check each major
- Sending scores vs. not sending scores
- Visit <u>www.fairtest.org</u> for more information



It's better to have scores and not need them than to not test

## Letters of Recommendation

#### **School Counselor Recommendation**

- School counselors write letters for each student
- Be sure to update your brag sheet in the fall

#### **Teacher Recommendations**

- All recommendations are confidential
- Pick a teacher from a core subject area ideally from junior year (i.e. Math, English, Science, History or World Language)
- Ask teacher prior to filling out the Google Form
  - Form available January 9th and due May 9th
  - o If school requires a second recommendation, get a secondary form from Ms. Benman
- Update teachers with application deadlines in the fall



## Letters of Recommendation

#### **Outside Recommendations**

- Invite recommender through Common App, if available
- Each college has a limit on how many they'll accept

## From CommonApp:

- Other recommenders are individuals you have worked with outside of school. They can provide context around your hobbies, passions, and other responsibilities
- The other recommender types available in the Common App are: Arts Teacher, Clergy, Coach, College Access Counselor, Employer, Family Member, Peer, or Other
- Each college can choose which types of other recommenders they accept.

- Class of 2026 Google Classroom
  - Due May 9th
- Update over the summer
- Spend time working on it
- Used to write your recommendation



# College Essay

- Common App essay prompts are available online at www.commonapp.org
  - Updated prompts available in the spring
- Many colleges will require additional supplemental essays/short answer questions
- Non-Common App schools may have different essay prompts
- Work on your college essay over the summer

# Admission Policies

Early Decision

Limited to applying to one school ED and EDII Binding Agreement - Required to attend if accepted

Early Action

Can apply to as many schools through EA Non-Binding agreement Early application review and early notification

Restrictive Early Action

Non-binding
College specific, very few schools have this option
Students may only apply to one college REA
Can't apply ED elsewhere, check college requirements
Can usually apply EA to public schools

## Admission Policies

Regular Decision

Apply by standard application deadline Allows more time to prepare application Usually notified by mid-April

Rolling Admissions

Applications reviewed as they come in Decision issued as soon as application processed Submit sooner rather than later

Students must submit a deposit by May 1st.

# College Visits

- Register on college websites
- Attend informational sessions, open houses, and tours
- It is helpful to visit colleges while in session
  - Speak with students about their experience
- See College Visit Questions handout on School
   Counseling website
- Attend In-Person & Virtual College Fairs
  - Students should keep their camera on
  - Be prepared to ask questions
- Students are allowed 4 absences/year to attend college or postsecondary visit



## MHS College Admissions Counselor Visits

- Over 100 colleges visit MHS in the fall
- Contact is key
  - Email admission representatives
  - Attend info sessions
  - Ask thoughtful questions
  - Show colleges that you're interested!



# Interviews

- Types of interviews:
  - Informational
  - Evaluative
  - Alumni
- Dress professionally
- Make eye contact
- Always send a thank you note





## Naviance

- Web-based tool used to research colleges and develop lists
  - Students apply to approximately 8 12 colleges
    - 2 safeties / 4 8 probables / 2-3 reaches
- GPA updated & uploaded to Naviance mid-year & end of year
- GPA updated every quarter senior year
- Primary parents/guardians will receive email with instructions to create parent/guardian Naviance account
