Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps Marine Option Scholarship

The Marines are looking for highly qualified high school seniors to apply for the 4-Year Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC) Scholarship! Last year seven students from across Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Massachusetts won the scholarship.

The Four Year NROTC Scholarship provides qualified high school students the opportunity to attend their chosen college fully tuition free and put them on the path to a rewarding career as a Marine Corps Officer.

The Scholarship pays for the entire tuition as well as book fees, uniform costs, and a monthly stipend. There are nearly 200 colleges nationwide that participate in the program.

If your student is selected, they will enter college next fall on scholarship. While participating in the program, they will train with and learn from the hand-picked Marines that lead the university's NROTC unit. At the same time, the student will experience a typical college life with their civilian peers.

Upon college graduation, they will be given the honor of commissioning as a Marine Corps Officer. They will then undertake several months of additional elite level training and serve full-time as an Active-Duty Marine Corps Officer.

To apply, students must meet the below requirements

- Citizenship: Must be a U.S. citizen. Dual citizens may also apply.
- Age: Must be between 17-23 years old by the time they start freshman year of college.
- Education level: Must be a current high school senior, and graduate high school no later than September 2024.
- Test Scores: Attain at least one of the below test scores before or during the application process:

SAT: 1000 combined score or better ACT: 22 combined score or better

ASVAB:: 74 or better

Physical Fitness: Applicants should be highly physically fit. All applicants will take the Marine Corps Physical Fitness Test during the application process, which Includes maximum effort pull-ups or push-ups, a 3-mile run, and a timed plank.

The application period is open now and closes January 31st! First selection board is in November.



Musicians talented in any of the following instruments are invited to apply: Oboe, Bassoon, Flute, Clarinet, Saxophone, Euphonium, French Horn, Trumpet, Trombone, Tuba, Bass Guitar, Guitar, Vocalist, and Percussion.

Establish Musical Qualification

When you contact me to begin the audition process, please provide a professional resume or brief description of your musical background and experience. In order to become eligible to serve as a Marine Musician, musical proficiency must be established in accordance with Marine Corps Audition Standards. Musical qualifications are conducted in two parts: (a) preliminary round and (b) audition round.



Preliminary Round

The preliminary round is used to establish musical background and the potential to succeed in the audition round. You will need to provide a video submission performing all instrument specific musical excerpts, which will be provided to you. Any additional works, solos and performances demonstrating overall strengths are encouraged and welcomed but are not required. Your video submission will be reviewed by our Musician Placement Director, a Marine Corps Bands member with over 15 years of experience as a Marine Corps Musician.

Audition Round

Based on the preliminary round, you may be invited to perform in the audition round. The Musician Placement Director will hold the audition round within your geographical area, which will be coordinated through myself or a local Marine Corps recruiter. This serves as the final determining factor for establishing musical entrance qualifications for service as a Marine Musician. The audition round for all brass and woodwind instrumentalists consists of the following:

Event 1 - Perform all required excerpts.

Event 2 – Perform sight-reading as provided by proctor.

If you are interested in auditioning, I will provide the required excerpts for your instruments upon request.
