WHAT IS THE NROTC SCHOLARSHIP?

- Career options: Nurse, Pilot, Naval Flight Officer, EOD, Special Warfare, Surface Warfare Officer, Submarine Officer
- UP TO **\$200,000**
 - Includes:
 - Full tuition (at over **160** schools)
 - A monthly stipend (**\$250** freshman, **\$300** Sophomore, **\$350** Junior, **\$400** Senior)
 - **\$750** for textbooks annually
 - Uniforms and Naval Science textbooks

HOW DO I APPLY?

- Eligibility requirements:

- Junior or Senior in high school (at least 17 years old)
- College freshman at a NON NROTC school (freshman at a NROTC school must apply through the school's NROTC unit)
- U.S. citizen, Naturalized citizen or in the process of becoming Naturalized (must obtain U.S. Citizenship within the first year in order to activate scholarship)
- Be able to commission before you turn 27
- Active duty Navy can apply BEFORE going to RTC (contract CANNOT ship before being reviewed at least 1 review board)
- Navy Reserves and OTHER Active Duty branches can apply at any time (within age constraints)

WHAT WILL I NEED TO APPLY?

- 3 references for evaluations (we will send a username and password to the email address you provide)
- Official Transcripts (can be submitted via Parchment; or signed copy emailed from Counselor)
- Applicant Fitness Assessment (Plank, 2 minutes of Pushups, 1 mile run)
- Officer Interview (MUST BE SCHEDULED WITH AN OFFICER AT A NROTC UNIT)
- 3 Statements (Drug and Alcohol, Debarment and Navy (Nurse Corp) Statement of Understanding)
- SAT/ACT test scores:
 - SAT: 540 Math, 550 English, 1100 Composite
 - ACT: 21 Math, 22 English, 44 Combined
 - Test scores can be used for 4 years.

AM I COMPETITIVE?

- The “Whole Person” Concept:
 - GPA (3.2 is competitive)
 - Volunteer work
 - Team involvement (chess, sports (high school or intramural), school paper, student body representative etc.)
 - Job experience
 - Leader and Followership experience
 - Extra Curricular (church, running group, NJROTC, Sea Cadets, MJROTC etc.)

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I GET SELECTED?

- You will complete a DoD Medical Review Board to determine if you are medically eligible for Military Service.
- You will serve 5 years on Active Duty at the completion of your Baccalaureate degree (4 years for the Nursing option)
- You will be awarded the **\$200,000** scholarship to most likely your FIRST choice school (in most cases, you can request a “School Change” after you are selected)
- New Student Indoctrination
 - This helps you integrate into your NROTC Unit successfully. More information can be found at:

WHAT IF I GET SELECTED BUT NO LONGER WANT TO GO TO COLLEGE?

- We are a “**non-obligation scholarship**”
 - If you are selected but don't want to take it, you don't have to!
DECLINE IT!
 - What if I go to college and I decide I don't want to continue with the scholarship?
 - You can discontinue your scholarship **before AUGUST 1st of your Sophomore year, if you notify your NROTC Unit and your school that you no longer wish to continue and follow up with necessary procedures.**

IMPORTANT DATES

- Applications open **April 1, 2024**
- Selection boards begin **October 2024**
- If no decision is reached on your application, it will automatically **“roll”** to the next board.
- Application submission deadline is **31 January 2025**.
- All documents must be received by the selection board by **February 2025**.

WHY NOW?

- Early submission guarantee's the most potential “looks” by the selection board.
- If your application makes it to the selection board in October, you have the potential be seen **9** times.
- As the season continues more applicants will apply creating greater competition for a limited number of slots.
 - In the first month of last season, we submitted **9** applicants. In the last month of the season, we submitted **55**.
- **THE EARLIER YOU SUBMIT THE BETTER!!!**

MINORITY SERVICING INSTITUTION (MSI) SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- An underutilized program open to **EVERYONE!**
- A separate scholarship to minority servicing institutions.
- Same application process with the following exceptions:
 - Must have selected “YES” to the MSI option question in your application.
 - The MSI school must be listed in your Top 5.
 - Officer Interview HAS to be completed with the Commanding Officer of the NROTC Unit.
- **STILL ELIGIBLE FOR THE NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP.** The MSI option gives you an additional review from a smaller amount of applicants.

MINORITY SERVICING INSTITUTION (MSI) SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- 17 Historically Black Colleges and Universities
- 3 High Hispanic Enrollment schools
- 1 Minority Servicing Institution
