


# **ABOUT METCO**




RACIALLY SEGREGATED




RACIALLY ISOLATED



Whatever you do on behalf of resident students, you do for METCO students because METCO students are treated the same as resident students. Refrain from calling METCO staff immediately.


Ask yourself: If this student lived here in our community, what would we do?


